A message from our Chairman and Chief

In November 2018, the SMJFL headquarters (HQ) moved from its temporary office at Keys Road back to RSEA Park as co-tenants with St Kilda Football Club, the Southern Football Netball League (SFNL), AFL Victoria (AFLV) regional staff and Sandringham Dragons (SD). The move back to Linton Street sees the entire football pathway under the one roof including juniors, NAB talent and senior football, all the away to AFL and AFLW. The SMJFL would like to thank St Kilda Football Club for their support, and look forward to continuing to build the relationship and develop football within the region.

Season 2019 had a later-than-normal start due to Easter and the school holidays, commencing on Friday 26 April. There were 15 rounds of football, plus finals, which saw the season conclude with 11,153 SMJFL players, 497 teams and 3,657 home and away matches. In addition there were 154 finals matches, 47 of which were Grand Finals, and 224 Lightning Carnival 'mini-games'.

Female participation continues to grow, spurred by the popularity of the AFLW. This season saw an increase of 155 girls in the league from 2018. This brought the season total to 2,513, growing from 72 to 133 teams. These numbers are expected to grow again when St Kilda Football Club enter the AFLW competition next year.

Whilst this expansion has exceeded all expectations, it has created some challenges for clubs and the league, including access to grounds, unisex facilities and volunteer administration. The League continued with the Melbourne South Facilities Strategy which was initiated by the SMJFL in 2018 and supported by football leagues across the region. Council partners and AFLV continue to provide strategic documentation to support the expansion, improvement and upgrading of infrastructure to develop the league's growth. AFLV this year

approved a \$25,000 grant for 150 lux lights to be installed at Scammell Reserve in Oakleigh. The league will continue to work with all clubs and advocate to Governments at all levels.

The Monarch SMJFL Umpire Academy continues to be the largest employer of football umpires in Australia for the second year running. In 2019, the number of umpires increased by 103 to 724 in total. Club Volunteer Umpires also increased by 63 volunteers in 2019. The academy is led by Umpire Academy Manager Cam Watts and his team of Umpire Coaches who provide mentoring, education and support to all umpires, the majority of them under the age of 18.

2019 Highlights

The league's new 2019-2021 Strategic Plan was launched in December 2018 and delivered to the clubs at the Annual General Meeting (AGM). The strategy focuses on three key pillars; Governance, Football and Community.

The SMJFL Club Conference was a new initiative attended by over 130 club volunteers, including Presidents, Secretaries, Coaching Directors and Child Safety Officers (CSO). The event received great feedback by the clubs and will remain a permanent fixture at the start of each year.

The Healthy Choices Canteens (HCC) initiative was piloted in 2019. This State Government-led program encourages healthy food options for kids in junior sport. In late 2016, the league made a commitment to remove all junk food sponsorships. In 2018, the league was successful in receiving a VicHealth grant and was part of the research for 'Reducing Junk Food in Sponsorship'. The league's commitment to health and wellness led to the appointment of League Dietitian, Sarina Lococo to develop resources for member clubs and their canteens. Through this pilot project, the league was able

to secure funding from Kingston, Bayside and Glen Eira City Councils. The league has also secured a major sponsor for the HCC in 2020 and will make the announcement in the coming months. Cabrini Emergency also signed on as a new partner this season. Cabrini offered all SMJFL players 50% off emergency visits. All Trainer bibs also carried the Cabrini logo which 100 of them were provided to clubs free of charge.

Thank you

Thank you to Monash University, who signed on for a further two years as the Major Partner of the league, ending in December 2020. The league would like to acknowledge Monash University for all their support of community junior football. Thank you also to the clubs for helping put up the Monash tear drop banners at all ground, which will continue to be a key feature.

Thank you to the clubs and their CSO's for their ongoing commitment to child safety. Clubs have been proactive with the child safety standards and developing a supportive and protective culture. The SMJFL continues to be a leader in Child Safety and will continue to look at what can be done to support clubs in this area.

The league is also fortunate to have an exceptional Executive team and staff led by Chief Executive Officer Sarah Loh and General Manager – Football and Operations, Emily Beventyre. The league has a dedicated Board



who volunteer so much of their time to ensure there is a safe and fair environment for all our players, regardless of gender or ability. The league would like to acknowledge the ongoing support of Parks Victoria, the six LGA's (Glen Eira, Monash, Kingston, Bayside, Port Phillip and Stonnington) and all the other Corporate Partners.

Thank you to all the club committees, game day officials, parents, family, friends and supporters. It is these individuals that form the fabric of each club and make Australian Football the great game it is. The league continues 'to provide kids a safe, supportive and inclusive environment which develops, promotes and encourages participation in Australian Football'. The league looks forward to 2020 and, in the words of our previous Chairman Peter Ryan, it continues to be 'about the kids'.

The SMJFL's 2019-2021 strategic plan was launched at the 2018 Annual General Meeting. The new plan ensures the league continues to support, develop and collaborate with kids, volunteers, clubs, partners and key stakeholders.

The SMJFL continues to be an employer of choice. The Staff Wellness Program launched in November 2018 by SMJFL Dietitian Sarina Lococo. Staff were regularly educated about healthy habits through challenges and activities. The staff, as part of the corporate partnership with MyPhysio, were given free services including regular health assessments and health checks.

The SMJFL regularly liases with WorkSafe to complete assessments and fulfill employer requirements. The league initiated contact with WorkSafe as part of the move into the new building with a positive result. The annual risk audit was also completed in hand with WorkSafe The league has its own OH&S committee, and has a representative on the RSEA Park safety committee.

The league has completed annual financial benchmarking to evaluate its expenditures and efficiency. The league also identified other revenue sources to minimise club operational costs. The league was successful in securing partnerships with new businesses and continuing partnerships with Monash University, Options Consulting Group and Monarch.



PILLAR I. GOVERNANCE

A new financial auditor was appointed in November 2018. Selwyn Cohen from Cohen Fasciani Chartered Accountants completed an audit at the end of the 2018 and 2019 financial years.

The league continues to work on league and club compliance, particularly focusing on child safety. In 2019, the league worked closely with Child Safety Officers to achieve our Round 4 target of 100 per cent compliance. All clubs were compliant with all standards by Round 5.





The league continued to see significant growth in participation over the 2019 season. There was a 1.84 per cent increase in the number of overall teams, including a 15.89 per cent increase in the number of girls-only teams. The league had 11,153 registered participants playing in over 3,657 fixtures with the South Metro Junior Football League in 2019, spanning across a total of 3,737 games.







GRADING


Thank you to the clubs that assisted the league in developing the new Grading Guidelines & Processes that were successfully implemented in 2019.

INTERLEAGUE PROGRAM

In this year's AFL Junior Championship, the Championship moved to a three-game series format, creating a developmental feel to the program. The program was led by Interleague Coaching DirectorMike Goldsmith and provided over 150 boys and girls with the opportunity to develop their football and produce their best in front of NAB League scouts. The coaching staff were, again, outstanding in their delivery of training, match day preparation and match day programs.

In another change to the Interleague Program in 2019, the league saw the U13 age group move away from the annual carnival against Yarra JFC. The Interleague Program continued its focus on the 'fundamentals' pivotal to player development.










Junior Talent Pathway for SMJFL Players



INTRALEAGUE COMMUNITY CUP

The annual Community Cup continued to be a standout event of the SMJFL season 100 promising players from each club participated in a four week training program, and competed in two games on the final day of the season. These players elevated their football skills and prepared themselves for potential Interleague and Next Generation Academy selection. This year, both boys teams competed for the Dal Santo/Brayshaw Cup, and girls in the Searle/??? Cup, with all players representing St Kilda or Melbourne wearing the team colours. The boys won by ? Girls won by ?

UMPIRE ACADEMY

The SMJFL Monarch Umpire Academy went from strength to strength in 2019. Umpire Academy numbers rose from 621 umpires in 2018 to 724 umpires in 2019, once again establishing the academy as the largest in Australia with the most ever junior umpires registered in any league. Thank you to the umpires for continuing to ensure a high standard of umpiring and for making sure the season ran smoothly.

Monarch partnered with the SMJFL in 2018 and intrinsic to the growth of the academy throughout the year. The SMJFL is extremely thankful to Monarch for their generous contributions and for supporting community football. The league looks forward to continuing the partnership with Monarch in the 2020 season.

The SMJFL Club Volunteer Umpire numbers increased from 330 volunteers in 2018 to 393 volunteers in 2019. These volunteers umpired the modified-rules competitions across the Under 8, Under 9 and Under 10 mixed competitions, and the Under 10 and Under 12 girls. The academy continued to receive tremendous support and dedication from the Club Volunteer Umpires. Club volunteer umpires new to the SMJFL attained their accreditation either by attending a workshop in the pre-season, or by completing the workshop online.

The Academy trained at three different bases this season. Monday night training continued at Sportscover Arena with the VAFA, becoming the third-year training with the senior league. This saw the academy transition more umpires to the VAFA than ever. Wednesday night training continued at Moorleigh Reserve for the majority of the season. For the six week lead-up to the Junior Metropolitan Championships in the middle of the season, the umpires moved to RSEA



Park. The umpires had access to the state-of-the-art theatrette, AFL-standard change rooms and facilities, and the back oval on Linton Street. This saw a 20 per cent increase in attendance at umpire training sessions. Across Monday and Wednesday training sessions, the academy had an average of 140 umpires at training each week, all keen to improve their skills.

The academy also saw the SFNL Umpires transition to Moorleigh Reserve and RSEA Park, training immediately after the academy allowing for the SMJFL umpires to have a taste of senior SFNL football. A record number of umpires transitioned to the SFNL this season, with the league picking up 44 umpires.

Spanning across the Under 11 to Under 18 competitions for the 2019 season, the academy attended 4,830 match day field umpire appointments. Recently appointed SMJFL Umpire Academy Appointments Coordinator Nick Ritchie managed to fill 96.83% of the total appointments. In what can be an extremely difficult job taking into consideration umpire availability, the location of grounds and whether or not the umpires also play football, the SMJFL commends Nick for his hard work.



THUNDER & LIGHTNING CARNIVAL



This year the league saw new partner Thunder Insurance jump on board with the SMJFL. The 2019 Thunder and Lightning Carnival was played over 2 weekends with standard modified rules. 157 teams from the Under 8s, Under 9s and Under 10s competed on the ovals one last time in a huge event. Highett, Port Melbourne, St Paul's McKinnon and Prahran Junior Football Clubs hosted the Carnival for a second year in a row. The Carnival, aptly renamed to fit the new partnership, included events for all players, coaches and spectators to get involved and enjoy the carnival.

PILLAR 3. COMMUNITY

Support, develop and collaborate with kids, volunteers, clubs, partners and other stakeholders.

The Community pillar oversees the strategic plan with a renewed focus on developing the SMJFL's involvement in the community. The SMJFL aims to continue to support, develop and collaborate - not only with our partners and stakeholders but also with the clubs, volunteers and kids who are the heart of the league. The addition of key staff to the business department has allowed the SMJFL to provide this support across all areas of the league.

The support from league corporate partners has continued to increase in 2019. In December, the league resigned with our Major Partner Monash University and Official Partner Options Consulting Group - both of whom continue to provide support and contribute to the development of the league. A number of new partners in Cabrini Emergency, Thunder Insurance, Sandringham Zebras, Family Insights, TAC and the Victorian Responsible Gambling Foundation were also signed

in 2019. Without the support of such great partners, the league would not be able to continue our high-quality football competition or development opportunities.

Other relationships with AFL Victoria, SFNL, VAFA and football partners, St Kilda FC and Melbourne FC have been critical in providing quality football competitions, pathways and environments. The league continued to work closely with the Football Development Managers for the region, Tiernan Abrecht, Gary Brown and Dale Wain, as well as our neighbours at the SFNL and Sandringham Dragons, to make the Southern Metropolitan region the best in the state. The partnerships with St Kilda FC and Melbourne FC have been critical in providing talented players and coaches to the elite level whilst giving the community access to unique AFL experiences.

The Club Development Coordinator, Dominique Bebbington, has continued to be the main point of contact for clubs, providing services and resources. Creating resources such as the Club Development Manual and delivering events such as the Club Conference will continue to develop the knowledge and skills of the league's volunteers.

The league is extremely proud of its charity partnership with the Robert



Connor Dawes Foundation (RCD). The clubs and their players and members have, for a third year, delivered an outstanding fundraising result for the foundation during the Kicking Goals for Brain Cancer Round. The round provided greater awareness of paediatric brain cancer and its research. Following the commitment to reducing junk food sponsorship in sport the league launched the Healthy Choices Canteen (HCC) program. The program was run by the SMJFL Dietitian Sarina Lococo. The league looks forward to seeing more SMJFL clubs joining this program in 2020.











HEALTHY CHOICES

The SMJFL is extremely proud of the Healthy Choices Canteen (HCC) initiative which launched during the 2019 season. The program was successfully piloted at Ormond IFC, where their patrons adjusted their habits while the canteen increased their profits. Caulfield Bears also took part in the initiative, and increased the sale of healthy foods at their club by 25 per cent.

The program was spearheaded by SMJFL Dietitian Sarina Lococo with the help of four Monash University dietetic students who spent seven weeks in the SMJFL offices as part of their internship course requirements. The students spent time cultivating the program by pitching to all clubs at the Club Conference, auditing the club facilities and menus, adjusting their existing menus to suit the program, and training the clubs to operate the program themselves.

Ormond JFC adapted the Healthy Choices Canteen program at the beginning of the 2019 season. The program has successfully shifted club culture and reshaped habits using a traffic light system. The canteen's goods have been more than 50% green, and less than 20% red. The availability of more healthy options has not only boosted overall sales, but sales of healthy items.

The sales of 'green' items, such as soup, pasta and bottled water, have more than doubled. The sales of

In 2019, the SMJFL recieved a combined total of \$19,500 in grants from Bayside, Glen Eira and Kingston City Councils for the Healthy Choices Canteen. This funding will allow the program to be adopted on a larger scale by additional clubs, and for training sessions to be run for the clubs' education.

The SMJFL is thankful for the support of all councils and Parks Victoria. The league looks forward to working with all again in the 2020 season to make the SMJFL the best it can be.

The SMJFL also recieved a \$25,000 grant from AFL Victoria for the installation of 150 lux lights at Scammell Reserve in Oakleigh South, allowing for night games at the location.



MONASH UNIVERSITY

Monash University entered its third year as the major partner of the SMJFL in 2019.

Monash University's financial support has continued to assist the league immensely by keeping finals free-of-charge for all families and attendees. The league was also supported by four Monash University students who assisted the league's dietitian Sarina Lococo in the creation of the Healthy Choices Canteen.

Monash University has been integral in the development of future leaders within the clubs of the league. The Monash University 'Leader of the Month' was awarded to six recipients in 2019.

On 31 July 2019, the SMJFL opened the Monash University Leadership Room. The room serves as the main meeting room of the SMJFL.

Each week, the SMJFL released the 'Monash University Monday Review' with a focus on the Under 17 Boys and Under 18 Girls. The Monash University South Metro Stars representative teams were heavily supported by Monash University throughout their respective games. The equipment and uniforms provided were a direct result of Monash University's contribution to the league.

Monarch signed with the SMJFL as a Premier partner in late 2018, and the partnership has been a huge success.

2018 was the first official year of the SMJFL Monarch Umpire Academy. The partnership enabled the league's umpires to have greater access to resources and equipment which provided crucial support for the growth of the academy's skills. The SMJFL staff uniforms and guernseys were all also embroided with Monarch branding.

Ormond were the inaugural winners of the Monarch 'Renew a Club' project, where the club will recieve a generous clubroom renewal, courtesy of Monarch.

The SMJFL also released a feature video with the Monarch Umpire Academy in Round 10, where the umpires discussed why they joined the academy, what it takes, and what they love most about being an umpire.

RCD FOUNDATION

The Robert Connor Dawes (RCD) Foundation is the SMJFL's official charity partner. The foundation, founded by the Dawes family in 2013, aims to raise money for paediatric brain cancer research following the loss of 18-year-old Connor Dawes to brain cancer six years ago.

The SMJFL celebrated its partnership with the RCD Foundation by holding the Kicking Goals for Brain Cancer Round during Round 12 of the SMJFL season. The combined efforts of the SMJFL clubs and community in selling beanies and donations

The SMJFL was also invited to the unveiling of St Kilda's Reconciliation Action Plan and participated in a welcome and smoking ceremony held at RSEA Park.

The league also continued to partner with St Kilda's major partners, Reflex and Pepper Money, in 2019.



The SMJFL Corporate Partnership Program (CPP) has been hugely successful in welcoming new partners and retaining existing corporate partners. The significant investment made by our partners has enabled the SMJFL to provide additional resources and investments into the operations and administration of the league.

CORPORATE PARTNERS

The league's chosen partnerships have assisted club volunteers, who now have more access to league staff and expertise. The injection of funds has also assisted clubs and their finances by ensuring team affiliation costs remain low.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

for the year ended 31 October 2019

I. Significant Accounting Policies

a. Incorporation

South Metro Junior Football League Inc. was incorporated on 5 January 2009.

b. Basis of preparation

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Interpretations and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Associations Incorporations Reform Act 2012.

The financial report of South Metro Junior Football League Inc. as an individual entity complies with Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards. Compliance with Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards ensures that the financial statements and notes comply with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

The financial report has been prepared under the historical cost convention modified by revaluations of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the league in the preparation and presentation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

c. Accounting policies

i. Revenue

Affiliation fees and sponsorships are recognised as revenue on a time proportional basis.

Revenue from the sale of goods, is recognized when the significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods have passed to the buyer and the costs incurred or to be incurred in respect of the transaction can be measured reliably. Risks and rewards of ownership are considered as having passed to the buyer upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Revenues from the provision of services are recognised upon delivery of the service.

Grant revenue is recognised in the income statement when it is controlled. When there are conditions attached to grant revenue relating to the use of those grants for specific purposes it is recognised in the balance sheet as a liability until such conditions are met or services provided.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

ii. Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments

with original maturities of three months or less.

iii. Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

iv. Financial instruments

Receivables

Trade and other receivables when initially recognised are measured at fair value, which normally approximates their nominal value. Subsequently they are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

Payables

Trade and other accounts payable are recognised when the association becomes obliged to make future payments resulting from the purchase of goods or services. When initially recognised they are measured at fair value, which normally approximates their nominal value. Subsequently they are measured at amortised cost.

v. Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value as indicated less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of items of property, plant and equipment are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The assets' residual values and useful lives of assets

are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted if appropriate.

vi. Contribution to Moorabbin Reserve Redevelopment

The Contribution to Moorabbin Reserve Redevelopment is carried at cost or fair value as indicated less, where applicable, any accumulated amortisation and impairment losses.

Amortisation

The Contribution to Moorabbin Reserve Redevelopment is amortised on a straight line basis over the period of the Lease Agreement, 25 years.

vii. Employee benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period.

Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs.

Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the entity to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

viii. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amount required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

ix. Income tax

No Provision for Income Tax has been raised, as the entity is exempt from Income Tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

x. Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense.

Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.
